Public Participation – No Comments

2/ Chairman McNeal opened the meeting to public participation. As there were no comments from the public, he declared the meeting closed to public participation and introduced Dr. Lynn Harvey who addressed the importance of intergovernmental communication.

Purpose of the Meeting

The purpose of meeting is to identify issues and opportunities for working together. Dr. Harvey asked everyone to think about some of the projects that have done in the past together. What are some of the future projects that need to be worked on? What needs to take place before we can work together collaboratively or move forward on any project?

Process:

The group divided participants into 4 work groups to:

- 1. Identify past intergovernmental projects
- 2. Identify emerging issues that require multi-unit focus.

After listing the emerging issues that require the municipalities to most effectively work together to accomplish, each participant was given 4 dots and with instructions to place each dot

on each of the projects he or she found to be most important or most critical to address. The areas which received the most number of votes were:

- 1. Jail Project [13 votes]
- 2. Facilities Master Plan [14 votes]
- 3. Wind energy Project/Energy Development [13 votes]
- 4. Higher education [7 votes]
- 5. Law Enforcement, Combine through the County [5 votes]
- 6. Senior Needs [5 votes]

What would it take to move some of these projects forward?

Vision Scope Mission Task Forces

Facilities Master Plan – County has identified the county participants and would like to invite the City and Township to participate. The County needs to get official support from the two municipalities. Equal representation on the task force is not needed, but the lines of communication should be kept open.

Some of the comments from the local municipalities which showed concerns they are having are:

- The county isn't always perceived as following through with what is stated. This can cause misinterpretation of actions and cause some to question if there are "hidden agendas".
- Need to regain trust in one-another.
- Local municipalities require more information about what is in the Facilities Master Plan before they have enough information to work with.
- Some feel they are being "told"; not being "consulted"

The next step is scheduling an informational meeting to allow the city & township to air any concerns and make sure everyone has the same information. The county will work with the local units to set a date for another meeting. Rob Sarro reminded everyone that information about the jail project and what the county has done so far can be found on the web site: www.allegancounty.org/jailproject.
