Community Novel H1N1 clinics in Allegan County

Allegan — the Allegan County Health Department is working with Allegan Healthcare Group, Inc. to offer the 2009-nH1N1 influenza vaccine to all of the CDC's target groups in community settings. You may also schedule a booster vaccine for those 9 years of age and younger if needed. The 2009-nH1N1 vaccine is currently available in a combination of settings such as health department clinics, healthcare provider offices, and other private settings, such as pharmacies and workplaces.

The next scheduled community off-site clinics will be:

Hamilton Elementary School, at 3472 Lincoln Rd in Hamilton, Mi. on December 2nd from 4:00 PM until 9:00PM and

Otsego High School at 550 Washington Av. Otsego, Mi. on December 3rd. from 4:00 PM until

To schedule an appointment for one of these clinics, call 269-686-4350 from 9:00 am- 6:00 pm, M-F. Before calling, please contact your primary doctor/healthcare provider since he or she might have the 2009-nH1N1 vaccine available. Many primary providers are getting this vaccine directly shipped to them. Additional community clinics will be scheduled as more vaccines become available.

These clinics are open to Allegan County Residents who fit within the target groups and are by appointment only. The Target Groups are:

- pregnant women,
- persons who live with or provide care for infants aged <6 months (e.g., parents, siblings, and daycare providers),
- health-care and emergency medical services personnel,
- persons aged 6 months--24 years, and
- persons aged 25--64 years who have medical conditions that put them at higher risk for influenza-related complications.
