



**Allegan County Health Department in Partnership with Allegan County Sheriff Department is offering the following American Heart Association's skill practices and evaluations for these online courses available on, <http://onlineaha.org/> In addition, traditional classroom AHA courses are available, please contact us at (269) 686-4523 for more information. All these AHA courses provide two-year certifications on completion.**

How the online course works:

To complete the selected Online AHA Course and receive a Course Completion Card, students must:

Part 1. Complete the online, cognitive portion of the course. Students can complete this portion either at the workplace or anywhere with Internet access. Students complete a series of modules that cover all required topics in the selected AHA Course. As with the classroom-based AHA Course, following each section of the online course, students complete a series of review questions. When students have finished all modules, a certificate of completion will be available for them to print. The certificate is required to complete Part 2 & 3. The fee for the online, cognitive portion will vary with courses, to enroll go to, <http://onlineaha.org/>

Part 2 & 3. Complete the hands-on online skills practice session with an American Heart Association Instructor at Allegan County Health Department or Sheriff Department. These evaluations could be brought to your employment site if six or more enroll. Upon successful completion of the skills practice session and passing of the skill evaluations, the student will earn an AHA Course Completion Card. A fee of \$30.00 per student will be required for a skills practice and evaluation session.

**Heartsaver® CPR & AED Online**

The Heartsaver® CPR & AED Online Part 1 Course offers a flexible, timesaving option for workplaces and organizations that need to provide safety training. This course is for those who have a duty to respond to a cardiac emergency because of job responsibilities and/or regulatory requirements. The complete course is delivered in three parts. Part 1 delivers the cognitive learning through Web based, self-paced modules. Parts 2 and 3 require students to meet with an American Heart Association Instructor to complete a hands-on skills practice session and a skills test. Upon successful completion of all three parts, the student will receive a course completion card valid for two years.

### **Heartsaver® First Aid Online**

Heartsaver First Aid Online Part 1 teaches basic first aid using a self-paced, Web-based course paired with a skills practice session with an American Heart Association Instructor. This online version of the classroom-based Heartsaver First Aid Course offers flexibility for workplaces and organizations that need to provide first aid training to their employees and/or clients, but face many logistical challenges using classroom-based training. The Heartsaver First Aid Online Part 1 Course teaches the same material as the classroom-based Heartsaver First Aid Course. Topics covered include First Aid Basics, Medical Emergencies, Injury Emergencies, and Environmental Emergencies.

### **Heartsaver® First Aid Online with CPR & AED (as required Teachers and Daycare providers Certification)**

This course offers a blended learning solution for first time or renewal first aid, and renewal CPR and AED training. This course (which requires completion of cognitive part 1, plus parts 2 and 3 practices and skill evaluations) meets State of Michigan First Aid and CPR requirements for daycare providers and teacher certifications. Part 1 delivers the cognitive portion through Web-based, self-paced modules. Parts 2 and 3 require the student to meet with an American Heart Association Instructor to complete a hands-on skills practice session and skills test. Upon successful completion of all three parts, the student will receive a course completion card valid for two years. **NOTE: Professional rescuers and healthcare providers should take “BLS for Healthcare Providers”.**

### **BLS HCP Online part 1**

The Basic Life Support for Healthcare Provider Online Part 1 Course offers a flexible training option either for busy healthcare professionals who would like to renew their healthcare provider card or for the first-time user who would like to earn a certification in BLS level CPR. The complete course is delivered in three parts. Part 1 delivers the cognitive learning through Web-based, self-paced modules. Parts 2 and 3 require students to meet with an American Heart Association Instructor to complete a hands-on skills practice session and a skills test. Upon successful completion of all three parts, students receive their healthcare provider course completion card.

**Traditional Classroom AHA Courses** These traditional courses are available for those that prefer the classroom learning experience. **Heartsaver® CPR & AED**

**Course Length: 3.5-hour Fee: \$45.00**

The American Heart Association’s “Heartsaver AED” course teaches CPR, Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) use, relief of choking and use of barrier devices for adults, children and infants. This classroom course is for those who have a duty to respond to a cardiac emergency because of job responsibilities or MISOHA or other regulatory requirements. NOTE: Professional rescuers and healthcare providers should take “BLS for Healthcare Providers” course.

**Heartsaver® First Aid with CPR & AED (as required Teachers and Daycare providers Certification) Course Length: 6-hour Fee: \$60.00**

American Heart Association’s “Heartsaver First Aid” course teaches CPR, AED use and how to manage illness and injuries in the first few minutes until professional help arrives. This course meets State of Michigan First Aid and CPR requirements for daycare providers and teachers. NOTE: Professional rescuers and healthcare providers should take “BLS for Healthcare Providers” course.

**BLS for Healthcare Providers**

**Course Length: 4-hour Fee: \$50.00**

**BLS for Healthcare Providers Recertification**

**Course Length: 3.5-hour Fee: 45.00**

This course teaches one- and two-rescuer CPR, choking rescue and use of Automatic External Defibrillators (AED), barrier devices, and bag valve masks for adults, children and infants. The BLS course is for professional rescuers and healthcare providers, and healthcare licensure.

**Allegan County Health Department Course:**

**Bloodborne Pathogen**

**Course Length: Varies Fee: Call to inquire**

The Federal OSHA Bloodborne Pathogen Standard was published in 1991. It was designed to reduce and minimize the potential for occupational exposure to the Human Immunodeficiency Virus, or more commonly referred to HIV, the Hepatitis B Virus (HBV) and other human Bloodborne pathogens. The course will inform participants about precautions they must take to eliminate the risk of infectious diseases that can be contracted through exposure and the proper methods of handling potential contaminants. A test, consisting of simple, multiple choice questions will follow in order to ensure that a participant have achieved the basic knowledge of Bloodborne pathogens.
