

## Proposals for November 2010 Ballot

### Countywide Proposal

#### SHERIFF'S OFFICE AND CORRECTIONS CENTER MILLAGE PROPOSITION

Shall the County of Allegan levy a new millage not to exceed 0.394 of one mill (\$0.394 per \$1,000 of taxable value) against all property in the County for a period not to exceed 20 years, beginning with the levy to be made in 2010 through 2029, for the purpose of constructing and equipping a new Sheriff's Office and Corrections Center with related site improvements? The amount of revenue raised by the levy in 2010 is estimated to be \$1,604,385.

#### **Dorr Township Proposed Library Millage**

Shall the 15-mill tax limitation on general ad valorem taxes within Dorr Township imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution be increased for said Township by .3 mill (\$0.30 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value) for a period of ten (10) years, commencing in 2010 and ending in 2019, inclusive, for the purpose of funding township library operations, and shall Dorr Township levy this millage for such purpose, commencing in 2010, thereby raising in the first year of such levy an estimated \$78,036.00?

#### **Lee Township Proposal**

Shall the limitation of the total amount of taxes which may be assessed against all real and personal property in Lee Township, Allegan County, Michigan, be increased by 2.00 mills (\$2.00 per each \$1,000.00 of taxable value) for a period of three (3) years, 2011-2013, inclusive, for the purpose of road construction and maintenance within the township? It is anticipated that the revenue collected by Lee Township as a result of this proposal will be \$116,463.58 in the first calendar year of the levy.

#### **Manlius Township Proposals**

##### **PROPOSAL TO RENEW EXISTING ROAD MILLAGE**

Shall the previous voted increase in the tax limitation impose under Article IX, Sec.6 of the Michigan Constitution on general ad valorem taxes with Manlius Township be renewed at 2.0 mills (\$2.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for the period of 2011 through 2016 inclusive for township road improvements; and shall the Township levy such renewal in millage for said purpose, thereby, collecting in the first year an estimated \$194,000.00?

##### **PROPOSAL TO RENEW EXISTING ROAD RESURFACING MILLAGE**

Shall the previous voted increase in the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution on general ad valorem taxes within Manlius Township be renewed at 1.5 mills (\$1.50 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for the period of 2011 through 2016 inclusive for township road improvements; and shall the Township levy such renewal in millage for said purpose, thereby, collecting in the first year an estimated \$145,500.00?

**Valley Township Proposal**

Shall the tax limitation on general ad valorem taxes within Valley Township imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution be increased for said township by two mills (\$2 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and levy it for two years, 2010 through 2012 inclusive, for township road improvements, which 2-mills increase will raise an estimated \$146,910.00 in the first year the millage is levied?

**SOUTH HAVEN PUBLIC SCHOOLS PROPOSAL****OPERATING MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL**

This proposal will allow the school district to levy the statutory rate of 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in South Haven Public Schools, Van Buren and Allegan Counties, Michigan, be increased by 17.4937 mills (\$17.4937 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period 3 years, 2011, 2012 and 2013, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2011 is approximately \$2,279,964 (this is a renewal of millage which expired with the 2010 tax levy)?
